Praying in the Name of Jesus

We are told to pray in the name of Jesus:

John 15:16 "Then the Father will give you whatever you ask in my name."

John 13: 13,14 "And I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father. You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it."

Colossians 3:17 "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."

Eph. 5:20 "always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Jesus is our mediator with the Father:

1 Tim. 2: 5,6 "For there is one God and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all men."

Heb. 9:15 "Christ is the mediator of a new covenant."

Rom. 8:34 "Christ Jesus who died-more than that, who was raised to life-is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us."

Heb. 7:24,25 "Because Jesus lives forever, he has a permanent priesthood.

Therefore he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them."

Eph. 3:12 "In him and through

faith in him we may approach God with freedom and confidence."

Praying in Jesus' name is also a testimony to those who hear us pray aloud.

John 11:41, 42 "So they took away the stone. Then Jesus looked up and said, 'Father, I thank you that you have heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the people standing here, that they may believe that you sent me."

Board Meeting Excerpts from Jan 12

Opening devotion and prayer was led by Jim Dain.

The December minutes were approved by general consensus.

Pastor Michael stated we had 5 baptisms January 3 with more to come in the near future. The connection groups have resumed on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Lorren Newingham has been hired as Nursery Attendant and may be able to help in other areas. Celebration Sunday, February 7, will also include the Congregational Meeting, Family Meal, and volunteer ministry fair in areas of ministry and service.

Rebecca reported unrestricted checking is \$78,607.74. We received \$50,000 the last week of December designated for sanctuary renovation.

Pastor Michael made a motion to payoff the administration building mortgage. Jim Dain seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's report was approved by general consensus.

Gretchen from United Community Bank said the bank will now waive our yearly safe deposit box fee of \$25.

The church garage sale will be April 1 & 2 this year.

Helen reported Children First needed the \$10,000 donation from the church granted in December. Their next board meeting will be January 21 with plans to discuss the summer program. All is going well with children, families, and staff.

Bobby stated discussion continues regarding an easement to the George Balsman property.

N.D. moved to declare the fair rental value portion of the Youth/Associate Minister's parsonage allowance at \$250 per month for 2016. Joyce seconded which carried unanimously.

The Feb 7 Family Meal proceeds will go towards the mission trip to Haiti.

Helen said the Orange Conference will be April 27-29. Conference fees for 4 were prepaid in 2015. She will need to know soon who is going and make travel arrangements.

Board members were asked to sign the consent form indicating they have read, understand, and approve the church policies provided in the board packet.

he's a good guy who doesn't like to have to ask for pardon so he just never does anything wrong. An understandable position, and a lofty goal to be sure. The problem is; it's also impossible.

""You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart." Matthew 5:27-28

You read that right. Jesus just compared lustful intent with adulterous betrayal of your wedding vows.

The Bible doubles down on this truth.

"If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us." 1 John 1:8
