Solution: Sandy flew to Nashville to attend Eliza's first dance recital and I drove to Terre Haute for Aria's Children's Community Theater play, "Charlotte's Web." We both had a great weekend and both very well entertained.

Also when attending Lance and Amber's church, I was blessed by having a different take on a passage of scripture that I've read and heard all my life, Matthew 14:14-33. Please read this passage. Here is my understanding of the verses.

- **Vs. 14** They witnessed his power
- Vs. 15 Disciples wanted to send people away for their own evening meals.
- Vs. 16 They don't need to leave, feed them.
- Vs. 17 The disciples set their own boundaries with limited food supply.
- Vs. 18 Jesus' response bring it to me!
- **Vs. 19** Everyone sat down, Jesus blesses the food and has his disciples distribute the food.
- Vs. 20-21 All had plenty and twelve baskets left over. Wow!!
- **Vs. 22** Jesus sends disciples ahead of him in a boat to cross sea of Galilee.
- Vs. 23 Jesus sends multitude away and goes to a mountain to pray.
- **Vs. 24** Ship is caught up in a major storm and disciples are struggling with ship.
- Vs. 25 Jesus goes to the ship by walking on the water. Wow!
- Vs. 26-27 They think he is a spirit and are terrified! But says "fear not it is I."
- **Vs. 28** Peter decides to "test" Jesus. If it is you allow me to come to you.
- Vs. 29 Peter walks out to Jesus. Awesome!
- **Vs. 30** But then Peter sees the waves, feels the wind and becomes afraid and begins to sink and cries out "Lord save me!"
- Vs. 31 Jesus reaches out and saves Peter from sinking and says, "oh ye of little faith, why did you doubt me?"
- **Vs. 32** When they came back into the boat the wind ceased and they worshipped Jesus, saying truly you are the son of God.

Sorry to be lengthy here but a question that the Pastor then asked was this—what about the other 11 that never tried getting out of the boat?

Its not recorded in scripture but it's almost a given that some more of them likely criticized and rebuked Peter for even attempting to try something so extraordinary. Then I got to thinking whether or not I've done the same thing. Not trying to walk on water, but criticized those who have attempted awesome programs, or projects and failed and then became the first to say, "I knew that wouldn't work!"

I applaud FCC for taking on some enormous projects and challenges before we become members here and we desire to continue to press on with ideas and ways to promote God's kingdom in this community! And the point of this devotion is to encourage us all to "step up" and "step out of the boat" and show our faith in Jesus! And if we fail and fall he will always be there to pick us up!

Current Youth Group Series: Activate

Science is fascinating. Even if you hate science class, you have to admit that the idea of conducting experiments is cool. It's amazing how adding just a few drops of one chemical can create a reaction, adding a few drops of another can stop or deactivate the same reaction and adding a few drips of a third chemical can make the first two glow in the dark or it can make them explode! What's crazy is that you can't tell by looking at something what reaction it will cause. Maybe it's an activator. Maybe it's a deactivator. Maybe it's neither. The only way to know is to keep testing it out and see what happens.

Believe it or not, this is something faith and science have in common. We all experience moments that have the potential to activate or deactivate our faith, and it's hard to tell at first glance which is happening. This was especially true in the life of one of Jesus' followers and dear friends, Peter. As we take a closer look at his ups and downs, we'll discover how sometimes the very experiences that threaten to destroy our faith are the ones that can activate it in a whole new way.
