Board Meeting Excerpts from September 13

Quorum of 9 met. Pastor Michael Ten Eyck was in attendance via Skype.

Call to Order at 6:05P.M. by the Moderator Bobby Smith.

Opening devotion and prayer was led by Phil Sandidge. Shared a reflection on Pastor Michael's sermon on Gideon. ... it's about Gideon (me). No, it's is about GOD!

The August minutes were approved by general consensus.

Minister's Report highlighted the importance of renewing Elder responsibilities.

Bethany reported that as of August 31, 2016:

- *Total Checking/Savings Assets =\$401,912.76. Total General Checking Assets =\$184,916.17. Total Budgeted Receipts =\$317,798.40.
- *Statement of Cash Flow on Nonbudgeted Receipts Total =\$52,600.50 and Nonbudgeted Disbursements =\$36,950.32. Difference of \$15,650.18.
- *Worship Attendance average for January thru August = 268 individuals.
- *66.67% through the fiscal year. Fiscal year Total Budgeted Disbursements =\$244,029.82 (54.36%)

The Treasurer's report was approved by general consensus.

Property: Damaged fence replaced at the Congregational Park. Door repaired at Admin Building. Sanctuary entry steps repaired.

Crossroads Center: N.D. Harrison made the motion to allow Illini Hospital the full use of the Crossroads Center as a back-up center for temporary housing and the resources available to continue hospital operation. Hamer Tate seconded the motion and all approved.

Children First: Board meeting September 15th.

New Business: Larry Wigington made the motion to accept Roger Brokaw, Joyce Lemons, Jill Kunzeman, Jade Roseberry, Kathy Curfman, and John Hull as the 2016 Nominating Committee. Seconded by David Koltveit and all proved. Ann Ferguson made the motion to appoint Roger Brokaw as the Nominating Committee chairperson. Seconded by David Koltveit and all approved.

I have entered the time of year where cross country meets and basketball games are falling on the same nights. It is great to support the kids, but it's a tad bit stressful trying to get to as many events as possible. The events are often held at schools that are an hour's drive away, and we can't leave town until after work. Inevitably, while trying to get to another rural school, I find myself behind a grain truck working on harvest, or a slow moving vehicle. Murphy 's Law continually proves true on these nights!

Last week, as my wife and I raced across the back roads to make the second of the evening's sporting events, I was passing a slow moving vehicle when my "Service Engine Soon" light came on. The first thing I thought of was that my car has over 200,000 miles on it and it is normal for that light to appear on a car with that kind of mileage. My instinct was to simply ignore it as "normal."

I laugh at myself because I am neither an ASE certified mechanic nor even a garage gear head. I can change oil, plug a tire, and on a good day replace an alternator... but that is about it. I decided to take my vehicle to someone who could check the code and see if it was a minor issue or a major one. After all, warning lights are there for a reason.

There are some warning lights in our spiritual walk as well. These are subtle indicators that are there to alert us to conditions that we need to address for optimal performance in our spiritual walk.

The great theologian A.W. Tozer framed these "warning lights" in seven questions that we can ask ourselves. When answered honestly, they can be an indicator of our spiritual health and areas of needed attention in our spiritual journey and health. They are:

- 1. What do we want most?
- 2. What do we think about most?
- 3. How do we use our money?
- 4. What do we do with our leisure time?
- 5. What kind of company do we enjoy?
- 6. Who and what do we admire?
- 7. What do we laugh at?

Take a moment and prayerfully look at your "instrument panel" in light of these questions. Are your honest answers lining up with God's word, or has the age in which we live begun to infiltrate our mind and soul to the point of leaving us somewhat tarnished and carnal?

Remember our study of Samson in light of the fact that he founded his life on self-interest rather than God's purpose for him.

James 1:26-27 If anyone thinks he is religious and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless. 27 Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world. ESV

Live the life God purposed for you! It is the path to fulfillment in Christ.
